

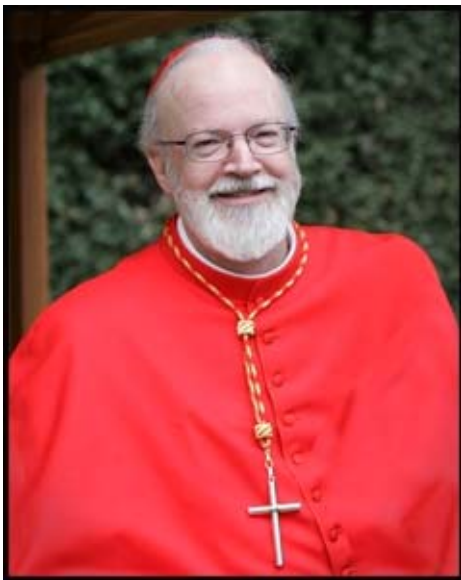

## *An Evening with Cardinal Sean O'Malley*



**Bio:** Cardinal Sean O'Malley was born Patrick O'Malley on June 29, 1944. One of three children, he grew up in Herman, Pennsylvania. When he was only twelve years old he enrolled in a school for teenagers contemplating the priesthood. Also during that time he discovered a love for languages and he now speaks six (English, Spanish, Portuguese, French, Italian and German).

When he was twenty-one, he entered the order of the **Capuchin-Franciscan Friars**, taking the vow of chastity, poverty and obedience and took the name of Sean. On July 14, 1968 he was professed as a member of the St. Augustine Province of the Order of Friars Minor Capuchin and was ordained to the Priesthood on **August 29, 1970**.

Early in his priestly service, he ministered to the Latino population in Washington, D.C., and later founded the **Hispanic Catholic Center**, an organization dedicated to helping local Hispanic immigrants with their medical, legal, and educational needs.

In 1984, **Pope John Paul II appointed Father O'Malley to be the Coadjutor Bishop of St. Thomas** in the Virgin Islands. A year later, he became its Ordinary. There he established a hospice for AIDS patients, worked tirelessly with the homeless and led the Church to help residents recover from a Category 5 hurricane.

In 1992, Bishop O'Malley was appointed Bishop of the **Fall River Diocese**, where he served for ten years. In late 2002, Pope John Paul II named him the Bishop of the **Diocese of Palm Beach, Florida**.

After only nine months of service to the people of Palm Beach, **Pope John Paul II appointed Bishop O'Malley to lead our Archdiocese of Boston**. Archbishop O'Malley was **elevated to Cardinal this past March 24** by Pope Benedict XVI.

The Archdiocese of Boston was established in 1808 and made a metropolitan archdiocese in 1875. It is comprised of five counties of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and has a Catholic population of approximately 2.1 million out of a total population of 3.9 million.
